What is PEACE Multicultural Services?

PEACE (Personal Education And Community Empowerment) Multicultural Services is a program of Relationships Australia SA that supports and assists individuals, families and communities from culturally and linguistically diverse (CALD) backgrounds who live in South Australia to lead balanced and healthy lives. PEACE works to increase awareness of problem gambling, HIV, sexually transmissible infections, viral hepatitis and related issues. The program aims to provide information, education, advocacy, referral and support for individuals, families and their communities.

PEACE employs people from diverse cultural backgrounds who are professionally trained to provide needed services in a culturally meaningful way. One of PEACE's most recent initiative is to implement a program designed to reach out to CALD communities with regards to the problem of gambling.

Why is the Community Ambassadors' program important?

People living in Australia are the world's leading gamblers, spending more money on gambling than any other country and ranking number six in the world in terms of overall gambling losses, the majority of which come from poker machines. Prevalence studies reveal that around 60-70 per cent of Australians participate in some form of gambling. The Australian Government's Problem Gambling website estimates that up to 500,000 Australians are at risk of becoming, or are already, problem gamblers.

Research tells us that in most CALD communities, seeking help outside one's family is considered to be an expression of the family's weakness in addressing problems internally and thus an indication of failure.

Recently PEACE Multicultural services in collaboration with the Office for Problem Gambling launched the first ever 'Culturally and Linguistically Diverse Gambling Help Action Plan 2015' following extensive consultation with over 20 different communities. The action plan highlights an enormous need to address stigma associated with gambling problems and seeking help. It also highlights the importance of community development and community education to address stigma and ease the process for individuals to seek help and address the issue of gambling in their life.



What is the 'Community Ambassadors' program?

The PEACE Community Ambassadors program is a strategy to ensure that CALD communities have access to information and support services related to gambling problems.

The Community Ambassadors are individuals who are well connected with their own communities or have been endorsed by their community leaders or are leaders themselves who are interested in learning about the issue of gambling, how to recognise the problem and its impact on the community. Following the 4 days training, Community Ambassadors will become a resource for their communities and act as a liaison between service providers and their respective communities, (Please refer to the attached PEACE Community ambassador's role description for further information). With the support of PEACE and other gambling help services, they will facilitate the delivery of information and promote an ongoing conversation regarding problem gambling in their community.

Community ambassadors will collectively be the core group helping PEACE Multicultural Services for developing culturally appropriate resources including the development of a gambling help website.

Community Ambassadors Graduation and the launch of the Website

In October 2016, Community Ambassadors will be recognised at a public event and awarded a certificate of completion by the Minister of Multicultural Services/Minister for Communities and Social Inclusion Hon. Zoe Bettison. At this event the Minister will also unveil the newly developed website by the PEACE Community Ambassadors.


What are the benefits of being a PEACE Community Ambassador?
